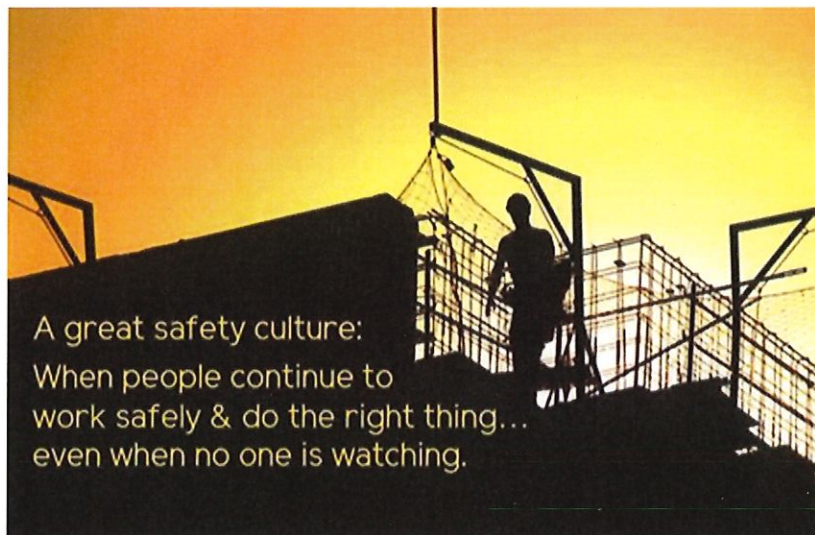
FAREWELL FROM BARBARA O'DONNELL as she retires after 18 years of service to ZSI.

OSHA NATIONAL SAFETY STAND-DOWN on Fall Prevention

Fatalities caused by falls from elevation continue to be a leading cause of death for construction employees, accounting for 370 of the 991 construction fatalities recorded in 2016. Those deaths were preventable. OSHA's national safety stand-down is to raise awareness of fall hazards across the country in an effort to stop fall fatalities and injuries.

On May 9th, Zebby Sulecki, Inc. participated in the national stand-down, discussing fall prevention. This was the third year that Zebby Sulecki has participated. We also took advantage of this opportunity to conduct our annual PFA harness inspections.
